SUBJECT: Shoulder Sleeve Insignia for the Utah Army National Guard Element, Joint Force Headquarters

1. The shoulder sleeve insignia for the Utah Army National Guard Element, Joint Force Headquarters retroactively reinstated on 13 January 2020, was originally approved via The Institute of Heraldry (TIOH) memo dated 5 March 1964

2. The description and symbolism of the design are as follows:

DESCRIPTION

On a yellow beehive 2 3/4 inches in height and 2 9/16 inches in width overall with 1/8 inch green border, a brown bee with yellow wings edged and detailed brown.

SYMBOLISM

The beehive taken form the seal of the State of Utah, represents the industry, activity and forward progress of the people of that state.

- 3. Enclosed for your use and retention are:
 - a. TIOH Drawing No. A-1-181
 - b. Digital artwork in color and black and white line
- 4. As a result, TIOH Drawing No. A-1-828 is cancelled effective 15 June 2020.

5. All manufacturing tools (hubs, dies and patterns) will be maintained by TIOH as part of our quality assurance program. In addition, TIOH retains a permanent record of the approved design and all correspondence for future reference. A set of standard SSI samples with procurement instructions and a list of our certified manufacturers was previously sent to the POC and mailing address on record.

6. This authorization is in accordance with AR 670-1 and DCS, G-1 approval memo dated 13 January 2020. A copy of this memo will become part of your permanent organizational history files.




SHOULDER SLEEVE INSIGNIA

Description. On a yellow beehive 2 3/4 inches in height and 2 9/16 inches in width overall with 1/8 inch green border, a brown bee with yellow wings edged and detailed brown.

Symbolism. The beehive taken form the seal of the State of Utah, represents the industry, activity and forward progress of the people of that state.

Background. The first design was approved for Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment, Utah National Guard on 1 February 1956 and amended to approve the insignia for Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment and other nondivisional units of the Utah National Guard. The first design was rescinded (cancelled) and a second design approved on 5 March 1964. The insignia was redesignated for Headquarters, State Area Command, Utah Army National Guard and the description amended on 30 December 1983. The third design was authorized on 10 October 1996. It was redesignated for the Utah Army National Guard Element, Joint Force Headquarters effective 1 October 2003. The third design was rescinded (cancelled) and the current design originally approved on 5 March 1964, reinstated for the Utah Army National Guard 2020 (TIOH Dwg. No. A-1-181)



DISTINCTIVE UNIT INSIGNIA

Description. A Gold color metal and enamel device 1 inch (2.54 cm) in height overall blazoned: On a wreath Or and Gules a bee hive beset with seven bees all Proper.

UTAH ARMY NATIONAL GUARD ELEMENT JOINT FORCE HEADQUARTERS

Symbolism. The insignia is taken from the crest, which is the seal of the State of Utah. As the territory was originally within the Spanish possessions, the twists of the heraldic wreath are yellow and red.

Background. The insignia was originally approved for State Staff and State Detachment, Utah Army National Guard on 16 September 1939. It was redesignated on 31 December 1970, for Headquarters and Headquarters Detachment and noncolor bearing units of the Utah Army National Guard. It was redesignated effective 1 October 1982, for Headquarters, State Area Command, Utah Army National Guard. The insignia was redesignated for the Utah Army National Guard Element, Joint Force Headquarters and amended to update the description and add a symbolism effective 1 October 2003.



CREST

Description. That for regiments and separate battalions of the Utah Army National Guard: From a wreath of colors, a beehive beset with seven bees, all Proper.

Symbolism. The crest is the seal of the State of Utah.

Background. The crest for color bearing organizations of the State of Utah was approved on 20 February 1924.
